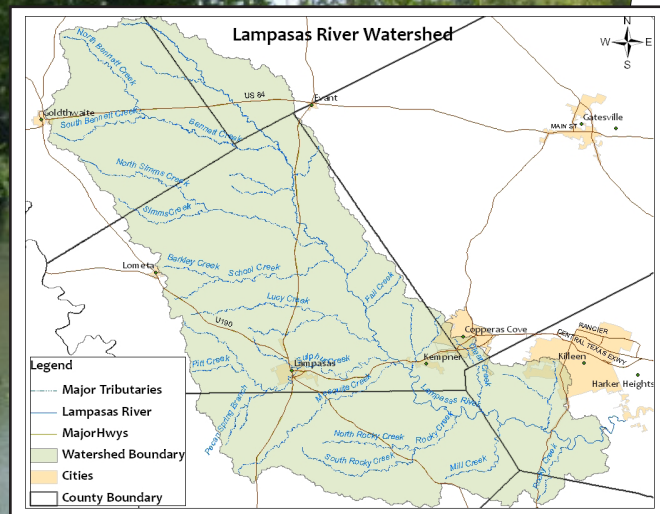
Free lunch starts at 12:30 for attendees that register by July 10th
